

Nursery Guidelines

1. No one is to enter the nursery except the caregivers, children and their parents.
2. All staff, paid and volunteer, must be screened and trained as stated in the SUMC Safe Sanctuary policy.
3. Sign-in your child and list any pertinent information that the nursery staff should be made aware of (allergies, feeding instructions, etc.).
4. Members and regular attendees will be assigned a permanent number that will be used when checking in/out. This number will appear on the parent's id bracelet and the child's name tag.
5. Visiting families will receive a temporary numbered bracelet/name tag. No child will be release to any adult without matching numbers. If a bracelet is lost, identification will be required (ex. State issued driver's license).
6. Prior arrangements must be made before or at the time of drop-off if someone other than the parent/guardian will be picking up the child. Along with verbal communication, written consent must be given to the nursery staff at drop-off (indicated on sign-in sheet).
7. Parents/Guardians will be notified immediately should an emergency arise.

Illness Policy

In order to minimize the spreading of germs and illnesses and to safeguard the health of the children and staff in our nursery, please cooperate with our illness policy.

Your child should be kept home when he/she has symptoms of a cold, an infection or any other contagious illness. Please do not bring your child to the nursery if your child has been ill within the previous 24 hour period.

Please do not bring your child to the nursery if your child is exhibiting any of the following symptoms:

Fever

Coughing and sneezing

Runny nose and/or watery eyes

Vomiting or diarrhea

Inflamed mouth/throat

Unusual/extreme fatigue
