Consent Calendar (Petitions 3 - 13) -

These include approving budgets, new board members for various camps, retirement homes, colleges, and commissions.

Council on Finance Petition to keep 2024 apportionments will be based on the 2023 totals with a 2% reduction (if paid on time).

Churches:

- I. 9 churches in the Western NC Conference have outstanding balances (as far as pension/insurance remittances are concerned).
- II. 5 churches closing (not disaffiliating).
- III. No reports of disaffiliations at this time (they were completed in May 2023 at called conference).

Lay Delegate Elections for Jurisdictional Conference in 2024.

Petition 14 – Local Church Creation Care Teams

"...Resolved that every local church is urged to form a Creation Care Team or strengthen an existing one for action in five areas each year – Worship, Discipleship, Stewardship, Mission and Evangelism..."

Petition 15 – Added "Fossil Fuels" to Methodist Investment screens

Before the conference invests in anything, they will now screen to make sure the investment is not in fossil fuels. This will not change prior investments.

Petition 16 - Parental Leave in WNC Conference

The Conference provides 90 days of Parental leave but depending on the area, it might not be paid leave. There will now be a fund that can be applied for in case the area does not pay the full 90-day leave.



Petition 17 – Encouraging Leadership with Integrity

If a lay delegate or clergy intend to disaffiliate from the UMC, that they will recuse themselves from all district, conference, commissions, etc. voting.

Petition 18 – Voting at Church Conferences

Voting at Church Conference shall be extended to active church members (as defined in the Petition).

Petition 19 – Creating a U.S. Regional Conference

WNC Conference urges the General Conference to pass the creation of US Regional Conferences in order for regions of the world to utilize their own cultures and diversity in making disciples in the world.

Petition 20 – Removal of Discriminatory Language from Book of Discipline

WNC Conference supports the 9 petitions going to General Conference to remove all discriminatory language from the Book of Discipline.

Petition 21 – Justice and Empowerment for LGBTQIA+ People

WNC Conference supports and amplifies queer delegates until changes can be made to the Book of Discipline.
