What Is an Advent Wreath?

The Advent Wreath is believed to have originated with a Lutheran pastor working among the poor in Germany in the late 1800s. Tradition goes that children would ask every day if Christmas had arrived, so he arranged candles (four large candles for the weeks and then smaller ones for the days) to help the children mark time and journey with Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem without leaving Germany. The wreath came to appear as it does today through the adoption of the practice by German Catholics, who decreased the wreath to just the candles we use today. Different traditions attribute different meanings to the candles, and even use different colors, but the purpose remains the same: to provide Christians with a way of marking time through the season of anticipation until we reach the birth of Jesus. For some, the wreath is a visual pilgrimage through Advent, similar to the idea behind the recreation of the crèche in churches and homes started by Francis of Assisi as a way of helping the poor experience holy sites from home. It is our hope at Skyland that the use of the Advent Wreath in worship will help you journey through this time of waiting and anticipation for when Christ is born in our hearts and in our world.
